My dear Phillip:

Thank you very much for your letter of July 11th and it is very nice of you to have written. Thank you also for enclosing a letter from Elsy Lazar. She had written to me some time ago and I wrote to her, and I hope it has reached her.

It must be, from all the reports that one hears, very serious in Europe apart from the few countries that are being nourished and maintained by America and other countries. This war has been so catastrophic and I do not think many realize what deep inner revolution must take place before there can be order and peace in the world again. So many are concerned with superficial readjustments and security that they are blind to that inner insecurity, realization of which is essential. Many are striving for an earthly paradise with utter emptiness and decay inwardly, and I think it is this inward clarification and understanding that is first necessary before trying to establish a worldly paradise which will always bring about wars and destruction without the other.

I am just going East for several group discussions and then I will come back here before going on to New Zealand, Australia and India in the middle of October.

I hope your family and you are well.
